Seattle Children's Theatre postpones *HELP* until 2010-11 Season

(Seattle, WA) – Seattle Children's Theatre has made the decision to postpone their planned production of *HELP*, which follows the early life of The Beatles, until the 2011-2012 Mainstage Season. In a letter to subscribers, SCT Artistic Director Linda Hartzell explained that logistical and budgetary concerns necessitated the move.

SCT will not be replacing *HELP* in the 2010-2011 season, with SCT looking instead at rental opportunities for that time slot. Subscribers who have purchased *HELP* will be offered a number of options, including selecting a different play in the upcoming season or holding their *HELP* tickets for the following season.

The remainder of SCT's 2010-2011 Mainstage Season remains unchanged, and includes productions of *The Green Sheep*, *Morgan's Journey*, *The Borrowers*, *Lyle the Crocodile*, *Go, Dog. Go!*, *The Man Who Planted Trees* and *Jackie and Me*. Subscription packages are available, and single tickets for *The Green Sheep* are currently on sale (single tickets for the remainder of the season go on sale in August). Seattle Children's Theatre, which will celebrate its 36th season in 2010-2011, performs September through June in the Charlotte Martin and Eve Alvord Theatres at Seattle Center. Since its inception, SCT has gained acclaim as a leading producer of professional theatre, educational programs and new scripts for young people. Through the end of the 2009-2010 season, SCT has presented over 200 plays, 103 of which were world premieres, and entertained over 4 million children.
