<b>Scene 2:</b> Elephant & Piggie Give a Gift	<ul> <li>Emotional moment</li> <li>Spotlight shines on actor in the audience</li> <li>Lights dim nearly to blackout</li> <li>Up to 88.3 dB</li> </ul>	
<b>Scene 3:</b> Squirrels Strategize	<ul><li>Lights dim nearly to blackout</li><li>Up to 89.1 dB</li></ul>	
<b>Scene 4:</b> Pigeon Catches a Song	<ul> <li>Actor in the audience</li> <li>Near-blackout with minimal light on the stage</li> <li>Up to 89.6 dB</li> </ul>	
<b>Scene 5:</b> Gerald and Piggie Shake It Up	<ul> <li>Bell sounds</li> <li>Lights raise up quickly (twice)</li> <li>Busy light effects (some strobelike effects)</li> </ul>
