Critically-acclaimed artist, Paige Hernandez returns to Seattle Children's Theatre presenting Havana Hop, a dance journey about discovering your roots!

(Seattle, WA) Seattle Children's Theatre (SCT) is thrilled to welcome back **Artist-in-Residence Paige Hernandez** with her vibrant one-woman show, *Havana Hop*, opening on October 16, 2024. Created by Hernandez herself, this dynamic production invites audiences to meet young Yeila as she travels to Cuba to connect with her grandmother, blending her hip-hop style with the rich rhythms of salsa.

Havana Hop is an exhilarating exploration of confidence, culture and identity, encouraging audience participation as Yeila discovers the joy of her multi-cultural heritage through dance. Throughout the performance, Hernandez expertly portrays three generations of spirited, confident women, bringing their stories to life and highlighting the importance of family connections and cultural roots. This interactive experience promises to engage and inspire audiences of all ages, inviting them to join Yeila on her journey of self-discovery and celebration of diversity. With its lively choreography and heartfelt storytelling, *Havana Hop* is set to leave a lasting impression on everyone who attends.

Paige Hernandez, a critically acclaimed multidisciplinary artist, brings a wealth of experience to the stage. With accolades that include multiple Helen Hayes nominations and recognition as a "classroom hero" by The Huffington Post, Paige's work has resonated nationally. Her collaborations with prestigious organizations such as Lincoln Center and The Kennedy Center further underscore her commitment to creating inclusive and impactful theatrical experiences. When asked about SCT's partnership with Hernandez, Artistic Director Idris Goodwin said *"Paige Hernandez is a vibe for the whole family."*

Audiences joining SCT for *Havana Hop* will be welcomed by a newly renovated lobby, which significantly enhances accessibility and introduces engaging elements designed to enrich the overall experience. In celebration of their 50th Anniversary season, this exciting upgrade creates a vibrant and inviting space where patrons can gather, connect, and immerse themselves in the magic of theater before the show begins. The renovations reflect our commitment to inclusivity and provide a warm atmosphere that invites everyone to be part of our artistic community.

SCT is collaborating closely with Hernandez as their 24-25 Artist-in-Residence. Throughout the run of *Havana Hop*, unique learning opportunities for students and community are available.

Hernandez will lend her knowledge to Fall Drama School class Tablecloth Theatre where participants learn to use theatre skills and their creativity to weave stories and craft characters using a tablecloth as their curtain. Hernandez offers students a chance to engage with her artistic process and learn from her experience in this engaging course for young actors.

Additionally, in partnership with the Sea Mar Museum of Chicano/a/Latino/a Culture, Hernandez will present an interactive spotlight performance of *Havana Hop* on October 24, 2024. The audience will see a full spotlight performance of Havana Hop on location at Sea Mar Museum, featuring language and music from the show, and will spend the evening learning some dance moves directly from Paige.
