In their upcoming production of *Luchadora!*, Seattle Children's Theatre (SCT) centers Mexican American culture, powerful girls and women, and the tradition of Lucha Libre Wrestling.

(Seattle, Wash.) SEATTLE – January 25, 2024 – SCT Associate Artistic Director Johamy Morales leads a dynamic team of "high flying" theatre artists to bring award-winning playwright Alvaro Saar Rios' timely new take, on an ancient tale, for the hearts and minds of Seattle youth and families.

Transport yourself to the world of lucha libre—Mexican wrestling, with this inspired adaptation of the Chinese legend Hua Mulan. The discovery of a worn pink wrestling mask prompts Nana Lupita, a Wisconsin grandmother, to share her coming of age story growing up in 1960s Texas. As we follow Lupita's journey, we witness her life as a daring teen tomboy; bike riding with her friends, working at her father's flower stand, and lucha libre. When a World Championship match is announced, Lupita's excitement explodes; she anticipates seeing it until she discovers her ailing father is one of the wrestlers. With the help of a magical mask maker, Lupita secretly trains to take her father's place. She soon finds it difficult keeping her secret from her friends and, most importantly, her father.

"This play is rooted on the power of passing on the stories of women that changed the narrative of societal expectation, and in many ways paved the way for today's generation of girls and women. As Nana Lupita celebrates her family's legacy and shares her story with her granddaughter Vanessa, she also empowers Vanessa to own their family story by literally becoming her younger self and telling it. In Mexican culture, when a family member shares a story about the past, it's symbolic of their coming of age."

With prominent Latinx artists in key roles, SCT is setting the stage for a timely production that's both authentic in its representation and groundbreaking in its approach. Collective expertise and passion for storytelling are the driving forces behind this rendition of Luchadora!, ensuring that every step of the process, every scene, every design element, echoes the richness of the narrative it celebrates. An action packed coming of age story, centered on three generations of Mexican American women, SCT's production brings to the forefront powerful, diverse voices that have long remained in the backdrop. Leading the charge is Johamy Morales, an internationally recognized theatre artist, educator, and changemaker. A child of Mexican immigrants, Morales exemplifies the spirit of the play — a blend of rich heritage and forward-thinking dynamism. Playwright Alvaro Saar Rios is a Texican playwright living in Chicago whose plays have been performed in New York City, Mexico City, Hawaii, Chicago, St. Louis, Milwaukee, and all over Texas. His award-winning plays include *Luchadora!, On The Wings of a Mariposa* and *Carmela Full of Wishes*, a stage adaptation of Matt de la Peña's children's book which SCT produced in their 22-23 Season.

Morales and Rios are working closely with a collective of artists to adapt and present the show for the SCT audience, including adapting some roles. With these changes, SCT's production will be the premiere of this version of the *Luchadora!* script.

The Collective:

- Alvaro Saar Rios: An award-winning, self-identified, "Texican" playwright, recognized for his commitment to new relevant stories for today's youth, who skillfully fuses cross-cultural narratives, creating a tale that resonates with depth and diversity.
- Johamy Morales: As the Director of our production, Morales' rich Mexican American heritage, combined with her expertise in Theatre for Young Audiences, brings a unique authenticity and heart to every moment of this production.
- Arnold Bueso: Creating the world of our play, Scenic Designer Bueso effortlessly encapsulates the Lucha Libre spirit, as well as the allusions to Mexican and Mexican American iconography and aesthetics.
- Jazmin Aurora Medina: As Costume Director, Aurora crafts costumes that merge the iconic Lucha Libre style with elements that underline our female-centric narrative.
- Predominate Latinx Cast: artist portrays a tapestry of characters, ensuring the story remains grounded in the diverse cultures and experiences they represent.
