ALLIANCE FOR GUN RESPONSIBILITY, THE 5TH AVENUE THEATRE, AND SEATTLE CHILDREN'S THEATRE PARTNERING TO PRESENT #ENOUGH PLAYS ABOUT GUN VIOLENCE THIS NOVEMBER

"Firearms are the leading cause of death for children and teens in Washington state. While school shootings dominate the narrative around children and gun violence, young people are more likely to be victims of unintentional shootings, domestic violence, or suicide. In fact, suicide accounts for 51 percent of all youth firearm deaths in Washington. Black children and teens in Washington are twice as likely to be killed by a gun as their white peers."

SEATTLE, Wash. - October 3, 2023 - Joining Arts and Culture organizations nationwide, Seattle Children's Theatre (SCT), The 5th Avenue Theatre, and Alliance for Gun Responsibility have created a partnership to present #ENOUGH Plays to End Gun Violence. Staged readings of six 10-minute plays confronting gun violence, which were submitted by emerging teen writers, will be presented on stage by student actors at Seattle Children's Theatre on November 6, 2023.

A Call for Help by Pepper Fox (Kentucky) A Disorderly House by Sam Lee Victor (New Jersey) Lightning Strike by Amanda Fagen (Montana) The Matter at Hand by Valentine Wulf (Washington) No Prospering Weapons by Justin Cameron Washington (Michigan) The Smiles Behind by Niarra C. Bell (Virginia)

Founded in 2019, **#ENOUGH! Plays to End Gun Violence** calls on teens to confront gun violence by creating new works of theatre that will spark critical conversations and inspire meaningful action in communities across the country. Now in its third year, #ENOUGH! has received more than 500 short plays by teen writers tackling gun violence. More than 100 organizations have participated in #ENOUGH!'s two previous Nationwide Readings in 2020 and 2022, involving nearly 2,000 artists and reaching more than 10,000 people.

For 2023, #ENOUGH! received 244 submissions from 36 states this past spring when it called on teens to write 10-minute plays on gun violence. Each winning playwright received a \$500 stipend sponsored by gun violence prevention organization Change the Ref, had their play published and licensed through Playscripts, Inc., and received a Guild membership and craft training through The Dramatists Guild. Winning plays were selected by renowned playwrights Idris Goodwin, Lauren Gunderson, Zora Howard, Samuel D. Hunter, David Henry Hwang, Octavio Solis, and Lloyd Suh.

Each organization's youth program - SCT's *Young Actor Institute*, The 5th Avenue Theatre's *Rising Star Project*, and The Alliance for Gun Responsibility Foundation`s Youth Program will each work to produce two of the six short plays. The final presentation will feature a crosspollination of young performers from each group and center youth activism in alignment with the values of the #ENOUGH national program.
